

Constance Cheng has more than four decades of dedication to the equestrian industry and sports. She has been a horse owner and an active rider almost all her life. She joined the Bukit Timah Saddle Club (BTSC) in the early 1970s. During her 17 years from 1976 in Sydney, Australia while working in the Property Development and Investment of houses and apartments in the Eastern suburbs of Sydney, NSW and in the CBD Sydney commercial buildings, she continued to follow her passion for horses. There she owned and raced thoroughbred horses, as well as running a spelling station for professional racehorses at flood free Bringelly.

She was an amateur race jockey for a number of years in Singapore, Malaysia and Australia. Upon her return to Singapore in the early 1990s while continuing on her expertise in property construction with medium sized construction companies on a project basis and also design and construction work for family and friends including building her own bungalow, she continued to own and race horses within the Singapore Turf Club and ride regularly at the BTSC.

At present, she owns and part-owns over 20 horses in and around Singapore, Malaysia, New Zealand and Australia. In her role as Racing Manager, she takes a very hands on approach with her horses, which includes attending weekly Tuesday morning track watch around 5:45am at the STC. She also owns a retired Melbourne Cup runner as her hacking horse at the BTSC.
